Getting to University College London (Days 1 & 2)

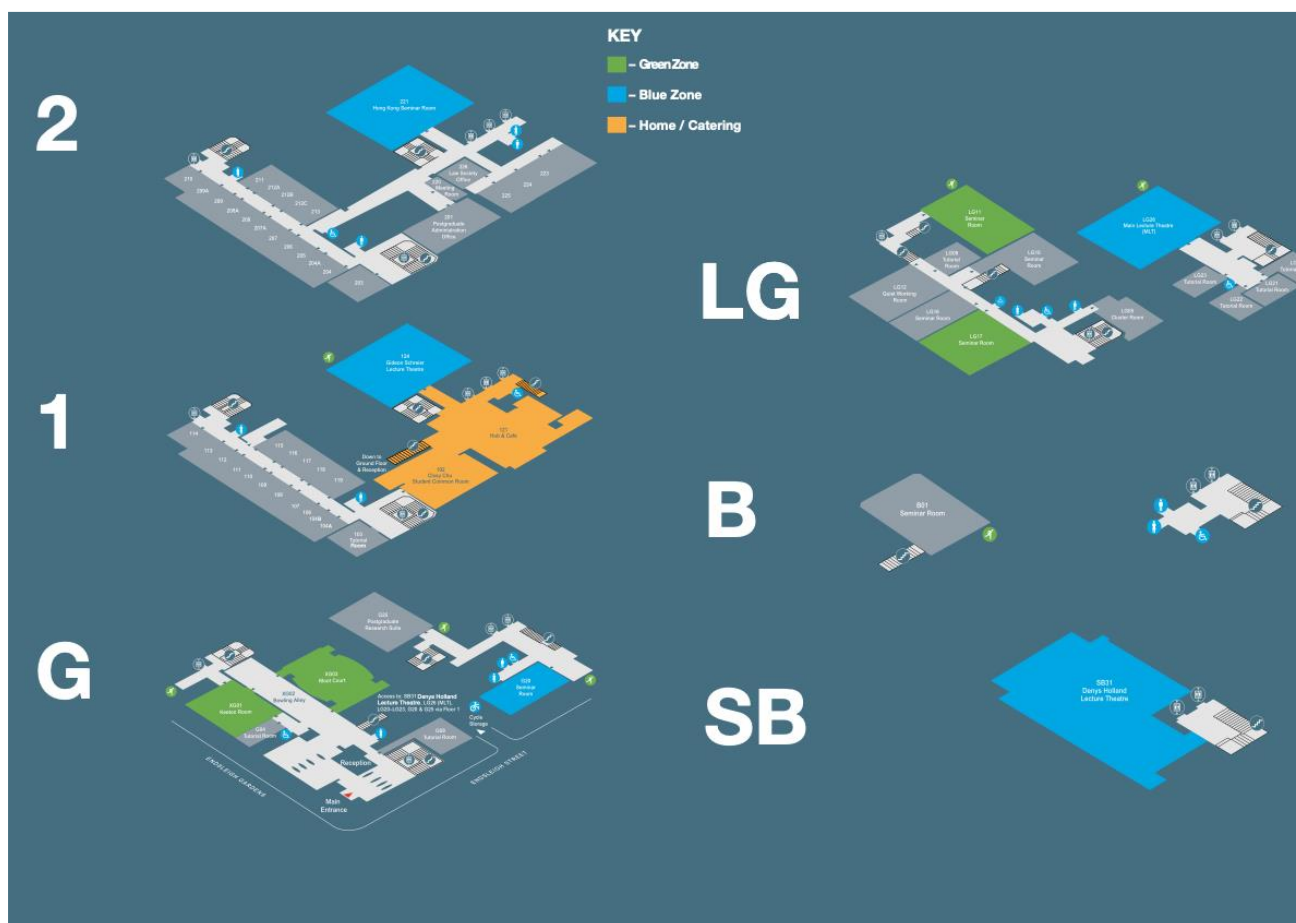
Days 1 and 2 will be held at [Bentham House](#). Please enter via the main entrance, which is on the corner between Endsleigh Gardens and Endsleigh Street. The closest tube stations are Euston, Euston Square, Russel Square and Kings Cross St Pancras, each of which is within a 10 minute walk.

Navigating inside Bentham House (Days 1 & 2)

Bentham House was originally two buildings, and is thus made up of an “old” part and a “new” part. This can make it confusing to get around the building.

To make things easier, we have colour-coded the programme such that rooms in the blue zone are in the new part, and rooms in the green zone are in the old part. If you’re in the right zone, you’re on the right side of the building and won’t be far away from your room. To transfer between “green” and “blue” zones, first go to the “hub” (the orange zone, where the bagels were on the first day), which connects the two.

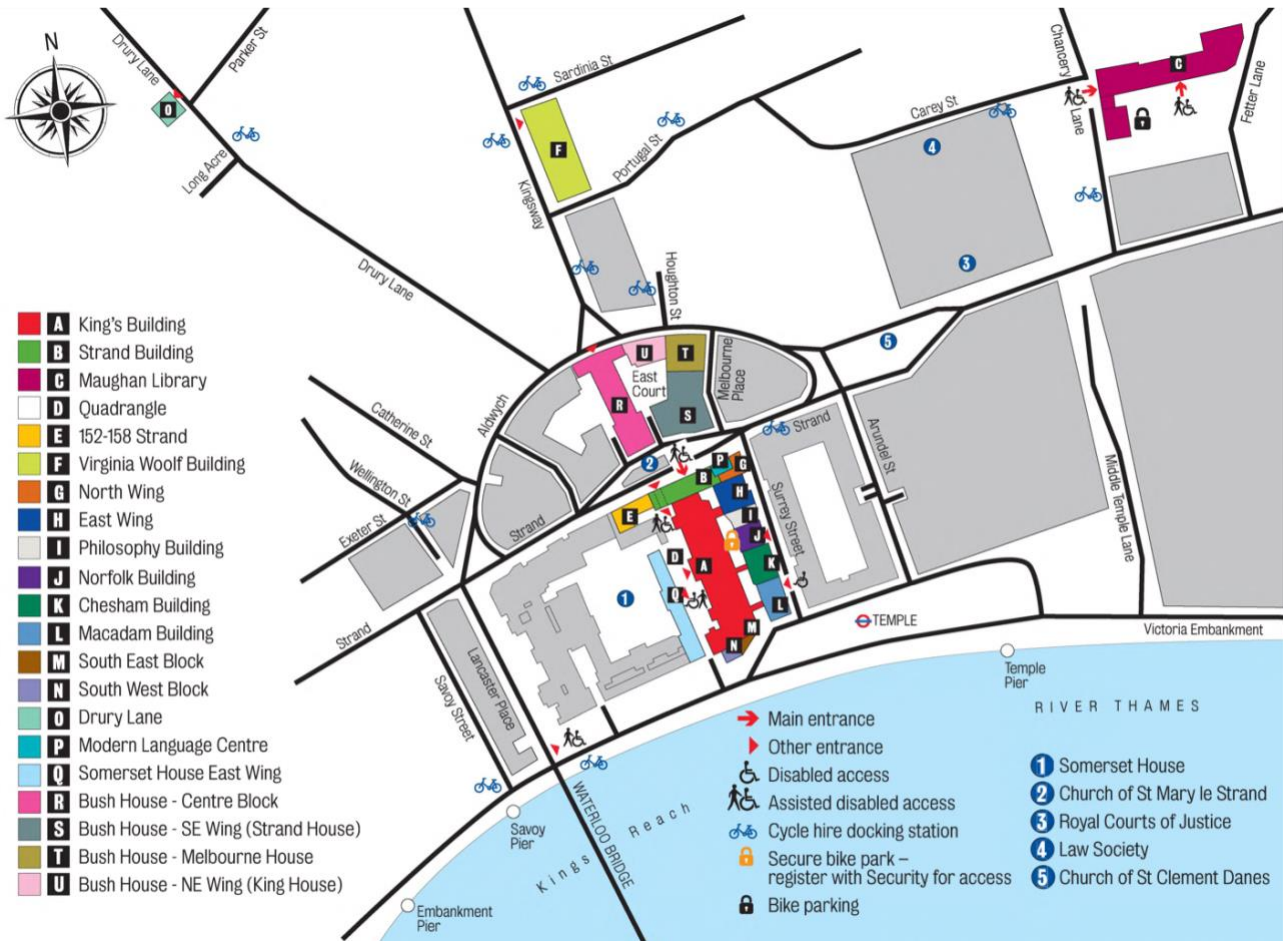
